10th May 1810

Dear Roberts

I have been to -
Ovts^l and have seen your watch; it is in
the hands of Mrs Dixon - Mr D has been
dead better than a year; and as I have
gone on purpose to Ovt^l which has cost
me to the expense of 2 Pounds - to clear
- myself of your supposing that it was my
fault - all I can say is this that Mrs D
will not give up the watch until she is
paid the 15/6 - you desired me to give
it to Mr Dixon I did - if you do not
know any person to forward it to you, as
it has been very badly used - and I have
written to Mr Maule who at Ovt^l - but
he refused receiving the money so as I might
have sent it to them - if you send me

a note I will get it forwarded to you
but the expense has been so great in letters
from the books to here and back - so say I
can do any thing further without being put
to any more expense I cannot - Compl^{ts}
to Mrs. Roberts and believe me
