NOTICE to the FEUARS and UDALLERS of Lands in the Bishopric of ORKNEY. As also, to the POSSESSORS or OCCUPIERS of the KING'S PROPERTY-LANDS in the said Bishopric.

THE Lease, in favour of LORD DUNDAS, of the Rents, Revenues, Teinds, great and small, Feu-duties, Teind-Tack Duties, Rental-bolls, and other emoluments belonging to the late Bishop of Orkney, having fallen by the demise of his late Majesty King George the Third: All such Revenues, Teinds, great and small, Feu-duties, Teind-Tack Duties, Rental-bolls, and other emoluments, payable by the said Feuars and Udallers, from and after the term of Whitsunday 1820, must be paid into his Majesty's Exchequer, at Edinburgh, for the use and behoof of his Majesty, or in such other way as the Barons of the said Court of Exchequer may hereafter direct, for behoof foresaid.

NOTICE is therefore hereby given, That all such by-gone Revenues, Teinds, great and small, Feu-duties, Teind-Tack Duties, Rental-bolls, and other payments due by you, from and after the said term of Whitsunday 1820, and those which shall hereafter become due, must be paid at the usual terms of payment into the said Court of Exchequer.

Note.—If any part of the bygone Rents, Revenues, Teinds, Feu-duties, Teind-Tack Duties, Rental-bolls, or other emoluments, from and since the said term of Whitsunday 1820, has been paid to Lord Dundas, or to any other person for his behoof, prior to the date of this Notice, you are requested to transmit to the King's Remembrancer in Exchequer, at Edinburgh, an account of the same.
