From our known zeal for his Majesty's person and
and subvert any attempts made against the Liberty and
enjoyment of such a happy Constitution the party of
Riots lately in this Country, headed by one Alexander
of London, and their adherents having upon excited
their rage against us into custody and placed us under
a guard when we were intirely defenceless and with the
but of Hospitality and rigour proceed to compel each of
us to pay certain Sums of money conform to a list or
Catalogue they had drawn up and to each of our names
in this list were prefixed some appellation such as the
word Active the Denominating as we supposed our
behaviour or action with regard to our being well affected
to the Government and the testimonials of our abhorrence
of their Scheme

This proceeding and Calculation of theirs we could
not but remonstrate against as unlaful and as Tyranny
under colour of what even they themselves urged to be
Justice However they having us intirely in their power
actually compelled us to pay each of us a particular Sum
of money ^{in part} amounting in whole to the Sum of £187.3s
conform ^{to the list} which is very ^{burdensome} to us con-
sidered be extorted from us by force or what they called
military Execution fire and sword and if by gone us
a full specimen of the Tyranny that might be executed in
general from them were they as Dupes as in this County
of Orkney ^{but} this was our consolation that the more that
appeared of this their cause the more the cause of Liberty would
prosper and flourish.

It would be vainly to trouble you with a par-
ticular enumeration of our actions, as the late rebellion
or the rebellion from the Government but would dare to imitate
with any great reluctance of His Majesty's Subjects in a hearty

and sincere wellwishing towards the present stable and happy
 constitution and which we have had the happiness
 to see compensated by the late glorious victory of the Royal
 Army over the detested Rebels at Culloden which will
 tend to render his Majesty's reign easy happy & glorious
 and to satisfy you ^{as} as to our integrity and our loyalty
 we are willing to produce Testificates from under the hand
 of the Ministers within our Majesty's or Lordship's and to
 instance our actions and conduct during the late rebellion
 as being well affected to his Majesty's person & government

Altho' that we would humbly beg if your ^{Highness} would
 please recommend us to our Remembrance
 and if his Majesty out of his Royal Bounty should be
 graciously pleased to appoint for that end
 we cannot but heartily congratulate you
 with good success on this last and wish that with good
 success with prosperity and to all his Majesty's
 your Honour and prosperity to all his Majesty's
