Dear Brother,

I regret that I had not an opportunity of seeing you before I left Glasgow, but being informed that there was a Brig in the harbour ready to sail to Leith direct and as my time was so limited I thought it most prudent to set off immediately, she was to call at Leith for Convoy, but in consequence of the stormy weather and the shifting of the Cargo she passed on to Hull, from whence we came by the Mail, which created such expence, that I am forced to desire you to remit me the £40 left me by ^{my} mother, for Return of Post, as I am so much reduced at present, that it will not be in my power to leave Edin^h, until I receive it. If you fail to comply with the above demand,
