we trust in him I wish Mr Hulme my
Send for me to ^{Com to} Quibake by the oportunitie that
you go with I would be Glad that Ant. Sore
or you would Send me the Stays by Jems Swain
& let them be fol in the Stomake as I am
troubled with a pen in my Stomake

I need not advise you to writ for, ^{you} know that
your Self what a Comfort it will be to your
Father & us all to hear often from you
we are all well & joins in our prayers to God
to God & Directe you & Remuinds
