of my sd father, qn soever the same or shall happen, and can make & grant the  
right underwritten. And now seeing I have already been for these severall years  
bygone abroad, and am yet resolved by Gods strength, to go & try my fate in  
the world, & i knowing perfectly well yt y<sup>e</sup> sd summe of one hundred pound scots  
and oþr summes y<sup>t</sup> were depended, on building y<sup>e</sup> houes & yards, y<sup>t</sup> are now built  
and planted upon y<sup>e</sup> sd ground was y<sup>e</sup> proper money belonging to my sd deceased  
moyr, as her dote & tocher, & having no nearer friend on my mothers side than  
John Johnston merchant in Stromness my uncle, who has already purchased the  
heredit right & property of the sd ground, houes & yards, from y<sup>e</sup> sd deceased  
Hele<sup>r</sup> manson, & to whom I own myself very much oblidged, considering yt  
he for a considerale time in my younger years, did mantain, intertain, and  
educate me in bed board & at school gratis, wtout any good deed, payt or rewar  
and also for severall oþr onerous causes, great respects, & good considerations  
moving me hereunto, Wit y<sup>e</sup> me, to have sold, assigned & disponeel, Likewise by  
the tenor hereof (in case it shall please God yt i shall happen to depart this  
mortall life abroad, wtout having heirs lawfully begotten of my own body)  
sell, assign, transferr & dispone from me, & all oþrs my heirs & assigneys of some  
ever, the heirs lawfully to be begotten of my own body, if any be, being espeded  
to and in favours of the sd John Johnston his heirs and assigneys of soever  
all right, title, interest, & claim of right qf soever, qch I have, or may have  
claim, or pretend in and to y<sup>e</sup> forsd ground, houes yards & oþrs built  
and planted y<sup>e</sup> upon, lying and bounded in manner forsaid but prejudice  
always to y<sup>e</sup> sd Adam Isbister my father to bruke & enjoy the same

During all ye days of his lifetime, and further with ye me for the  
reasons and causes for said to have made and constitute. Likewise  
the tenor hereof in the case for said make nominate, constitute and  
appoint the said John Johnston and his forsaids my lawfull cess-  
ers and assigneys in and to the said summe of one hundred pound  
scots money contained in the said heritable bond, and in and to the  
haill other summs, that my said father and deceasid mother have  
waird out and expended in building the houses and yards  
built and planted by them upon the forsaid ground, and otherways  
waird out by them for writing the said heritable bond and paying  
infestment thereupon if any be payed, and likeways in and to the
