bounded in manner after mentioned did bounded from James Grumblies & William McEvils marches on the south & northwards theron fadons & from the
sounding as said above the shore on the east to Sellen Smiths marches on the west lyand at the shore tyde of Stromness minland late Bishopric & now Shewdenay
recently poche freeholdes of Orkney And that by her seale infoldments & manner of holding the said poise to be holden of me & my aires in free blach for
my said spouses payment of and paying such money nomine all fermes si potest lantum And the other of the said infoldments to be taken from us com fadons of
our Invidiall dacefull Sinedis ipso for payment yearly of thryd sculling tos money foraid at the said tyme of Whitsunday and such other dacies as are
mentioned & contained in the originnall rightes & baronieties of the same And that either by resignacn or confirmation as beth shall please the
said Sellen McKinlay my said spouse And for that office shall make grant Subscript & delver to her all manner of writs requisite
for Sovereing her and the premises Likewise now as if the said infoldments were already past & excede & then as now I bind & oblige
me & my aires & Successors after to warrant occupye depnd All & I do also the said tenement of land house yards & oys @ mense
during the next redemptione ipso To the said Sellen McKinlay my spouse in lyfetoun as said is from my own proper fact & deed all mannerly &
done or to be done in prejudic herof With full power to the said Sellen McKinlay my said spouse In rane she shall happen to survive me
imediately after my dease to bruke & injoy the said land & yairds & oys foraid Tenant & possessor to entitell & in pitt ipso & therinill ac
her pleasure And for that office warrieng to serve dacefulls of remouing & precept of evictione to obtaine & recover and the
same to due executione tyme to pitt and to do every other thing requisite and the premises Redemable allways under reseruacion
In manner & conforme to and heritable land granted by Sellen Mansone sonelyng spouse to the now deas George Dallas sonelyng mentioned in
Stromness heritable proprieitie off said poise myt ground with wende of her said husband to me & the now also deas Elizabeth Le C Paine
first spouse & ours therin mentioned of the date the eighth day of June one thousand seven hundred & eight years
