My Dear Mr^s Johnston

I received your kind letter a
long time past and ought to have Acknowledged it sooner

to Edin^g met a very severe Affliction the loss of his sweet

many in that way - yet it is our Duty to do what we

all our wishes, I have just seen our Friend Dr^r
Fisher once since his return to Edin and he was so much
in haste I had no time to Ask him what you wished me

self very rich it is too late in the season for this year to
