My little Betsy is allways talking of her Grandpapa and tells her friends that his howse and garden is prettier than any she sees hear and often wishes to see you. My brother stays at Uncl's & is better pleas'd with his lodgings than he was last winter. And I have the pleasure to aquaint you that he is on a very good footing with Uncle and Mr Purse.
