Us Magnus, Isobele and Sibbilla Grays, lawfull children to the deceast Robert Gray, sometime shipmaster in Stromness in Orkney, and only heirs to the also deceast Robert Gray, our brother, sometime sailler in London, grant us to have received from John Crafts, merch^t of London, and that by the hands of Cap^t George Squirrel, Commander of the Sea Horse, frigott, the sum of Eighteen Pounds Ten Shillings Ster^{lg} money, which fell due to us after the decease of our said brother. Whereof we grant the receipt thereof renumeing all exceptions to the contrairy. Therefore we hereby discharge the said John Crafts and Capt George Squirrell their heirs administrators and all others concerned of the said sum of eighteen pounds ten shillings sterling money for now and ever. Obleidgeing us conjointly and severally, our heirs and successors conjointly and severally, towards this our discharge to the said John Crafts and Cap^t Squirrel and their foresaids at all law... In witness whereof we have hereunto sett our and sealed att Stromness in Orkney the thirty day of May, One Thousand Seven Hundred and (thirty) eight years.
