Dear Brother,

We are all very glade to hear of your arriving & in good health. Your father was growing very unhapay befor your letter came. If you doo not writt him evry third or fourth post he'l think your not well or something is the matter. I hope you'l not forgate to satisfy your affec^t father. We all strive to divert him as much as we can but we are all very lonely & thinks much long for you and for a sound (?) of your fidal & flout. Father plays on the fidal but I have not heard a flout since you went away.

We have not seen Mr Mondy since you went. He's gon to London with Sir Thomas Sands (?) He says he will lodg in Captain Ritsharts. I hope you'l see him & send us all letters by him. I will be glad to see you hear on your passage to Quibake. I am grown better of my eye and see the day light as I did befor thank god for it. The box that I sent Molly to London I have sent it to you with your shirts. You'l keep it in remembrance of me. Give my love to all friends & am your affec^t sister
