He said he had nothing particular to say, but would write soon. He lives N<sup>o</sup> 14 Lambeth Road. He is married. I do not know how long he means to stay in town. I called on M<sup>r</sup> Bremner who told me he had heard from Mr Taylor in Halifax in March last and that he was very well but M<sup>r</sup> B can give me no information respecting the parcel that he sent to M<sup>rs</sup> Johnstone. I have sent agreeable to your request the moade (?) lining and edging for M<sup>rs</sup> Johnstone's cloak, and I hope it will give her and you satisfaction. I am sure that I have done my endeavour that it should. I have inclosed the bill and would wish you when it is convenient and agreeable to pay the money to M<sup>r</sup> Oman. M<sup>rs</sup> Dickson join me in wishing compliments to you & M<sup>rs</sup> Johnston and your mother. We are all in good health thank God & hope you are the same. From
