My dear Niece,

This wil be handed you by your sister Mrs Urhuart. No doubt you wil all be surprised at her unexpected return. She is a good worthy woman (who) has suffered much in this cuntery at same time you throu it with great propriety. It is a pitty thou it often hapens that such characters are the greatest sufferers in this world. Her present situation makes it still harder upon her but it is a comfort to her that she is gowing to reside amongst her near relations whou I doubt not wil endever as much as possible to aleviat and sooth her troubles.

Since I wrot you last there is 2 young ladies of Quebec married. Miss Lynd to M^r Tomas Grant, brother to the laste M^r James Grant, Miss Holand to Lieutenant Walker of the Royal Fusileers.

We have lost another head of a family from the Lower Town, Cap^t Marten whou died last year soon after his arrival in England. M^{rs} Woolsy is well and desires to be remembered to you. I wil refer you to M^{rs} Urhart for the partickulars of ower oun family and believe me to be
